Dr. Seran family therapist captivated theminds the Nappinai of Saturday 9th of **Iuly** 2016as she explained parents ,the the ways help them toteach children different to to adapt the norms thesociety. The doctor exhorted the parents and teachers solved anger management and said that problems should be on through communication The counsellor remarked that all the childrenaretalented and that all the talents of the kids were be identified and developed Involvement. she said would make children less hyperactive.

The psychotherapist observed that every parent is a psychologist . She wanted the parents to prepare the firstborn to receive the newborn. She was stern against the idea of making kids dance like a doll before all. The psychologist said that it was fine if the kids cried on the first day of the school as they would evolve as fine girls and boys by class eleven . The therapist admonished the parents to abstain from giving junk food to the kids and rather to give healthy food to them . The doctor gave a strict no-no to T.V serials and video games that encouraged violence and killing . She opined that sensitive kids were over-protected.

Drawing a fine analogy with learning cycling , the counsellor said that teaching the kids to write was similar to the way we learned to cycle . Initially, the hand is to be held and then left . Addressing the mothers, she said kids tend to vomit when there is lack of variety in food . She also asked the parents to be innovative in cooking . The psychologist warned the parents to keep talking to the child or else to face a day when the child stop talking to the parents.

The doctor advised the teachers not to teach the children to attack exams . She instructed the staff to avoid comparisons and to teach values to the children. The counsellor explained that children have only a very short attention span and we need to manage time wisely . She appealed to the teachers to be very friendly with the students and to treat them as adults. Dr. Nappinai opined that we need to bring about desirable behaviour changes and make kids adaptable to the society. She also said that it is important to let the child explore his intelligence. Today, children are vulnerable to depression and they do not have buffers . Teachers ought to be very careful as to what they say because children value their teachers' words.

According to the guidelines set by CBSE for Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation, students of classes IX and X were involved in an Inter-Disciplinary Project between 2:00 to 4:30 p.m. on the first week of August 2016 in the presence of the subject teachers in their own classrooms. It was taken up for FA2 Assessment under the CCE scheme.



The activities undertaken by class IX included Drafting an

Advertisement on Potable Water, Assignment on Water as A Universal Solvent, Slogan Writing on Water Conservation, Assignment on Water Wastage, while the Activities Class X were engaged in included Poster-Designing on Water as a Resource, Assignment on Wind Energy, Questionnaire on Conservation of Water etcetera...Students were split into eight groups of five to six members and the activities were done as a collaborative project. 
SESSION 2- TOGETHER WE GROW


qualities in Malala. In this activity, students were made to reflect on their life values and positive qualities of their team members.


SESSION 7- LIVING MY VALUES
